
Dear Members of RXIII,



The 27th Chapters Regional Conference (CRC) of ASHRAE Region XIII took place in Macau on 16 and 17 August 2024, organized by the ASHRAE Macao Chapter. The conference featured a range of activities, including seminars, technical sessions, student technical visits, presentations by Society officers, and award ceremonies for the Region.

Participants included members and students from chapters across Macau, Hong Kong, Taiwan, Japan, South Korea, Singapore, Malaysia, Thailand, Indonesia, and the Philippines. Notable attendees included ASHRAE Treasurer Ms. Sarah Maston, Director and Regional Chair Mr.

C.W. Leong, Vice President Chandra Sekhar, Research Promotion Committee Chairman Mr. Les Pereira, and Director of Technology Ms. Stephanie C. Reiniche. Distinguished lecturers from the U.S., Dr. Drury B. Crawley and Mr. Luke Leung, along with experts from Japan, Dr. M. Kitaro Mizuide, and from Hong Kong, Ms. Melody Wong, delivered keynote speeches during the technical seminars.









The event attracted 250 attendees, including nearly 100 local engineering professionals from Macau. International conferences like this one enhance cross-regional cooperation, elevate the engineering expertise of participants, and boost Macau's global standing in hosting conferences and events. 

Region Members Council Representative Update

Dear Esteemed Members,

Annual chapter health assessment is due and will be conducted before 2nd week of January. This evaluation is akin to our annual body medical check-up. The objective of which is to assess the health of a chapter and to determine if a chapter's health is categorized as a) normal chapter, or b) struggling chapter, or c) weak chapter, or d) failing chapter. Last year, the health of all chapters in Regional XIII were assessed to be normal chapter, that is, none is a struggling chapter and thus, no further action is required from chapter leaders. While that was an impressive achievement of all chapters, we should not sit on laurel of past glory. Instead, we must not only continually achieve normal chapter status but target higher rating of assessment. How about a branding of "high performing chapters"?

Just to recap, the assessments initiated by Society are based on fifteen (15) action items and their corresponding maximum points are as shown in table below:

When we scrutinize the main action items as tabulated above, they are the usual activities which are being carried out dutifully and responsibly by Chapter Presidents, BOGs and chapter chairs. To achieve the maximum points of 185, what are required is to execute the action items timely, with quantitative and qualitative outputs that meet the MBO, goals of grassroot committees and others as guided in the Manual of Chapter Operations. The Plan-Do-Check-Act cycle of management framework has always been the beacon of all chapters in the implementation of our activities.

While the range of points for a normal chapter lies between 100 to 185, I am confident that collectively all chapters aspire to strive for the third quartile of this range of points simply for the fact that the quest for high achievement and taking challenges are embedded in the genes of our members and chapters. Therefore, a minimum entry point of 100 is out of the equation for us. With this setting, let's target to be "high performing chapters" attaining healthy points of 160 and above for this Society Year and beyond.

I take this opportunity to wish all a Happy, Blessed and Successful 2025.

2024.10.24 Taiwan Industry Week
