

Building Services System Design

Assessment Rubrics

These rubrics have a dual purpose: (1) to give a guideline for students about the criteria and overall expectations from the module, and (2) to establish a common guideline for design tutors and supervisors, in evaluating the design reports and presentations.

Assessment Rubrics for Oral Presentations:

Oral Communication: Expressing ideas clearly when communicating orally.

Content (20%)	Cannot show integrative knowledge and basic design for building services systems.	Show little integrative knowledge and fair design for building services systems. Organization (20%)	Presentation is very confused and unclear. Listeners cannot follow it.	Listener can follow presentation with effort. Organization not well thought out. Pace and delivery (20%)	Presentation is far too long or far too short. Speakers generally are too fast or too slow. Presentation is a Planned conversation, paced for audience understanding.
Use of visual aids (15%)	No aids are used, or they are so poorly prepared that they detract from the presentation.	Aids are poorly prepared or used inappropriately. Font is too small. Team work skills (15%)	Team work was hardly observed. The distribution and transitions of presentation work load was hardly compromised.	Not every member contributed to the presentation. Transitions from one speaker to another were smooth and team members generally supported each other.	Every member had equal chances of presenting the materials. Assessment Rubrics for Design Reports:

Report writing: An effective report presents and analyses facts and evidence that are relevant to the specific problem or issue of the report brief.

Organization and writing (20%)	Design information and details are not organized, are hard to follow and understand.	Design information is scattered and needs further development. Clarity and coherence (20%)	All the information is not clearly presented. Lack of coherence and logical consistency.	Some information is not clearly presented. Weak coherence and logical consistency. Drawing skills (15%)	Poor drawings and unclear diagrams. Many errors in symbols and lines.	Drawings and diagrams are clear but not applied properly. Some errors in symbols and lines.	Drawings and diagrams are clear and effective. No errors and correct format.	Drawings and diagrams are professional and effective. No errors and correct format.
Innovation and creativity (10%)	No new or innovative ideas are applied in the design.	Some attempts to propose new or innovative ideas in the design.	Innovative and creative design ideas are proposed, but no justification.	Innovative and creative design ideas are proposed with evaluation and justification.
Teamwork (15%)	Team work was hardly observed. Each member prepares the writing in isolation with no coordination.	Some planning and coordination are shown in the writing, but team work is not smooth and effective.	Every member contributes and collaborates in the writing. Good coordination and consistent style are observed.	Every member contributes and collaborates in the writing. Effective coordination and division of work are achieved.

Assessment Rubrics for Poster Exhibition:

Poster exhibition: Posters are used as a type of marketing tool to communicate with the audiences or visitors. An effective design of a poster should encompass the key aspect(s) of the project in a visually appealing way. The overall look of the poster should be aesthetically pleasing to the people passing by.

Relevance/Message (20%)	The poster is lacking a message and is very poorly designed in depicting anything related to the topic.	The poster is acceptable in relaying a message but does lack clarity. Creativity (20%)	Poor use of creativity and has no originality.	The poster is acceptably creative but may lack some uniqueness. Attractiveness (20%)	The poster is distractingly messy and very poorly designed. It is not attractive.	The poster is acceptably attractive though it may be a bit messy.	The poster is attractive in terms of design, layout, and neatness.	The poster is exceptionally attractive in terms of design, layout, and neatness.
Visual Impact (20%)	The poster has no impact on impacts a person's view of the topic.	The poster has an acceptable impacts a person's view of the topic.	The poster has a great impacts a person's view of the topic.	The poster exceptionally impacts a person's view of the topic.
Visual Presentation (20%)	Not very visually appealing; cluttered; colours and patterns hinder readability; use of font sizes/ variations to facilitate the organization, presentation, and readability is inconsistent and distracting.	Visual appeal is adequate; somewhat cluttered; colours and patterns detract from readability; use of font sizes/ variations to facilitate the organization, presentation, and readability is somewhat inconsistent and distractions.	Overall visually appealing; not cluttered; colours and patterns support readability; adequate use of font sizes/ variations to facilitate the organization, presentation, and readability.	Overall visually appealing; not cluttered; colours and patterns enhance readability; uses font sizes/ variations which facilitate the organization, presentation, and readability.
